Question 035:

How will the 2018-2025 Energy Efficiency Rolling Portfolio Business Plan ensure that midstream and upstream programs do not subsidize energy efficiency equipment or measures that are installed by contractors that violate permit or code requirements?

Response to Question 035:

Many of SCE's midstream and upstream programs provide incentives to other entities (e.g., retailers, manufacturers, etc.) to increase the proliferation of energy-efficient products. The intent of these programs is not to verify installation compliance. For those Commission approved EE programs in which SCE contracts directly with a third-party implementer, SCE's Commission approved EE programs use contractors who comply with all applicable federal, state, regional and local laws, including permit and code requirements, and who are licensed and legally authorized to perform such work. However, SCE cannot affirmatively police all of the contractors or subcontractors to ensure they comply with every single permit or code requirements.
