Subject: Supplemental: California Energy Efficiency Coordinating Committee Meeting Plans and Budget for Program Year 2016

Purpose

Pacific Gas and Electric Company (PG&E), on behalf of the California Energy Efficiency Coordinating Committee (CAEECC), hereby submits this supplemental Advice Letter pursuant to Decision (D.) 15-10-028 (Decision), Ordering Paragraphs (OP) 10 and 11. The Committee consists of member representatives from the following entities: PG&E, Southern California Edison Company (SCE), San Diego Gas and Electric Company (SDG&E), Southern California Gas Company (SoCalGas), the Bay Area Regional Energy Network (BayREN), the Southern California Regional Energy Network (SoCalREN), Marin Clean Energy (MCE), the California Public Utilities Commission's (Commission or CPUC's) Office of Ratepayer Advocates (ORA), the California Energy Commission (CEC), Greenlining Institute, the Center for Sustainable Energy (CSE), Lincus Inc., the Natural Resources Defense Council (NRDC), the Local Government Sustainable Energy Coalition (LGSEC), the San Joaquin Valley Clean Energy Organization, the South Bay Cities Council of Governments, the County of Ventura, the San Francisco Department of the Environment, CalCERTs, the California Energy Efficiency Industry Council (CEEIC), California Advanced Lighting Controls Training Program (CALCTP), Sheet Metal Workers Local 104, and the California Labor Management Cooperation Committee (LMCC) (a joint project of the National Electrical Contractors Association (NECA) and the International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers (IBEW)).

This advice filing seeks approval from the Commission for the updated schedule of CAEECC meetings and subcommittee meetings.

Background

D.15-10-028, *Energy Efficiency Goals for 2016 and Beyond and Energy Efficiency Rolling Portfolio Mechanics* ordered the Stakeholders to select a Program Administrator

(PA) to file an annual Tier 1 Advice Letter setting out the Coordinating Committee meeting plans and budget for the year.¹ On January 29, 2016, PG&E filed Advice Letter 3681-G/4785-E, which covered the meeting plan component. This Advice Letter provides updates to the schedule.

PG&E will file a second supplement that covers the proposed budget once a request for proposals (RFP) for a full time facilitator is issued.

To meet the guidelines ordered in the Decision,² stakeholders met initially on January 15, 2016 at the Pacific Energy Center in San Francisco to discuss the Committee's charter, membership requirements, roles and responsibilities, PA business plan templates, potential meeting facilitators, and proposed meeting schedule.

Facilitator

CAEECC hired an interim facilitator until a permanent facilitator could be determined. CAEECC developed a task force composed of interested CAEECC members that has

been discussing the scope of work for the interim and permanent facilitator, as well as the timing and process for request for proposals (RFP) solicitation, and other related items.

The task force will determine a proposed budget for both the interim and permanent facilitators, to be vetted by the full CAEECC prior to filing with the Commission. PG&E will file another supplement to this Advice Letter once the budget has been determined by CAEECC.

This filing will not increase any current rate or charge, cause the withdrawal of service, or conflict with any rate schedule or rule.
