In-person Location Details

San Francisco Bay Area Metro Center (BayREN Office, Yerba Buena Room 109)

375 Beale Street, San Francisco, CA 94105

The meeting is in the Yerba Buena Room (Room 109), a conference room on the first floor of the Bay Area Metro Center.

Access Information: There is no security protocol to enter the room.

- Room 109 Yerba Buena is on the first floor of the Bay Area Metro Center, 375 Beale Street, San Francisco, 94105.
- The room is just off the atrium to the right as you enter the front doors and publicly accessible.

<u>Public Transit</u>: The Bay Area Metro Center is just blocks from the <u>Salesforce Transit</u> <u>Center</u> and the San Francisco Ferry Building. It is easily accessible by public transit (<u>BART</u>, Muni, Caltrain and ferry).

<u>Parking</u>: Please note that parking can be difficult. There are public and private parking garages in the area and limited metered street parking.

Transportation Tips from Irvine Train Station:

- The Irvine Train Station serves both Amtrak & Metrolink and is located at 15215
 Barranca Parkway, Irvine, CA 92618
- Easiest way to get from the train station to TEC's office is by car: it is a 5-minute drive/Uber/carpool from the train station to the office.
- 40-70 min Bus/Shuttle: take the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA)
 Bus Route 480, which has a stop at Technology-Ent 16 Technology, or use the
 free Irvine CONNECT shuttle service for various parts of the community. For

more specific routing, you can use the <u>moovitapp.com website</u> or the <u>City of Irvine's transportation page</u>.

<u>Parking:</u> There is open and free parking on-site. The area highlighted in yellow (below) is the best place to park and closest to the building where TEC's office is located.
