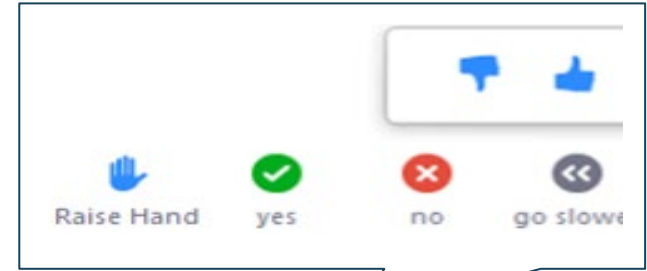

Water Infrastructure Program

Program Background

The Water Infrastructure Program (WIP) is a Resource Acquisition program that supports energy efficiency projects for Public Agencies with water & wastewater treatment facilities and systems.

Program Performance

Enrollment challenges due to:

- Lengthy project development and procurement timelines
- Operational constraints at facilities that led to schedule changes
- Competing capital funding priorities

Together, these challenges have contributed to lower than anticipated enrollment and slower growth project pipeline **within this specific sub segment**

Closure and Transition Steps

Program Update

- To streamline program offerings, SoCalREN is closing WIP as a standalone program
- Any potential Projects of this sub-segment will now be served through the SoCalREN Streamlined Savings Pathway program (SSP).
- There will be no gap in incentives and or services provided to water infrastructure projects already committed during this time of transition.

Program Transition Steps

1. Update the SSP implementation plan to incorporate WIP services and incentives
2. Solicit feedback from stakeholders
3. Incorporate program closure into Mid-cycle True Up Advice Letter



Transition to SSP

Existing WIP Customers

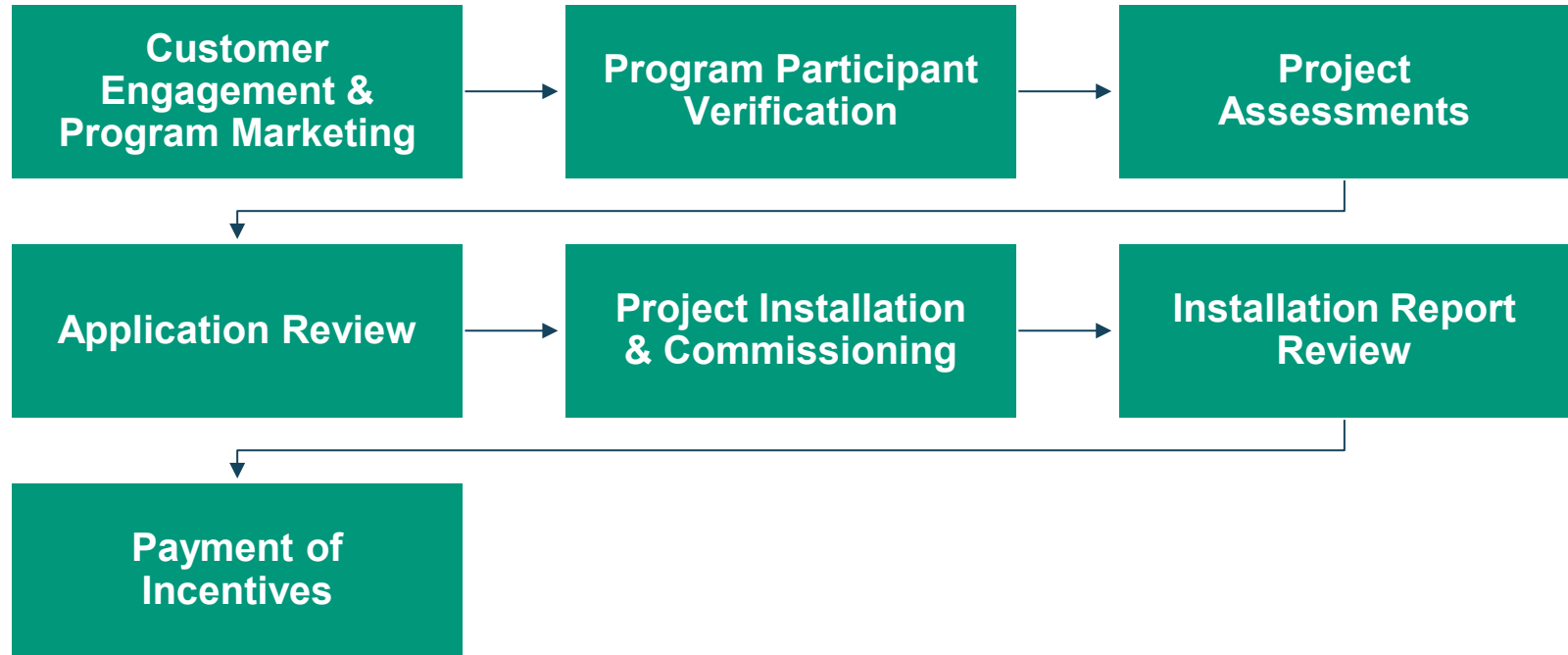
- Approved projects will continue to be reported through CEDARs
- Technical assistance continues
- Existing Incentive Commitments remain unchanged
- Reporting and Compliance continue through project closeout.

Future Customers

- New water and wastewater projects would in the future be submitted through SSP
- Technical assistance continues through PDP & SSP
- Eligible projects can access incentives through SSP
- SoCalREN staff will guide customers through the SSP process.
